



### A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Arapahoe Girls Basketball Supporters,

Thank you for purchasing our 2016-2017 Arapahoe Girls Basketball Program and assisting the Arapahoe Girls Basketball Booster Club and our student-athletes. Parent support and involvement is absolutely essential at AHS, and we appreciate you!

This year marks the 53rd Anniversary of Arapahoe High School. Under the leadership of Head Coach, Mr. Jerry Knafelc, Arapahoe's Athletic Director, Mr. Pat McCabe, and with the support of our Arapahoe Girls Basketball Booster Club our girls are prepared to compete within the prestigious Centennial League against the largest high schools in Colorado: Cherokee Trail, Cherry Creek, Eaglecrest, Grandview, Mullen, Overland, and Smoky Hill. Good coaches are good teachers! Our coaching staff has worked hard to condition, train, and prepare our athletes physically, as well as mentally. These young ladies value team unity, and have strong knowledge of the game including the intricate plays on both the offensive and defensive side of the ball.

Our students, just like students from other schools, learn from adult behaviors and attitudes. It is expected that, as adults, we will set positive examples of encouragement and sportsmanship at all times. Respect, civility, dignity, sportsmanship, and safety shall be the guiding principles of the Centennial League. We ask our student athletes to always do their best, and we should expect no less from ourselves. Since none of us can predict which of these athletes may have the potential to become American Olympians or collegiate or professional athletes, we should always strive to be encouraging and supportive adults.

Continued commitment to a strong athletic program as well as outstanding academic achievement is vital to Arapahoe's continued success. Just over \$24 million in scholarship money was offered to the 2016 graduating class. Last spring nearly 643 Advanced Placement examinations were written with many students scoring well enough to earn college credit. Arapahoe has consistently scored among the highest ACT scores anywhere. Our drop-out rate is less than 1% and 93% of our graduates go on to college. Since few of our Arapahoe athletes ever reach the professional level in any sport, it is important to place more importance on academic achievement. This strong academic preparation plays out in athletics in the form of competition for college scholarships as well as in the ability of our scholar-athletes to make commitments, participate as members of a team, support others, and enhance character.

At Arapahoe, we expect our students to demonstrate the positive attributes of the **Warrior**. We have gained knowledge and understanding over the past 23 years through our relationship with the people of the **Arapaho Tribal Nation**. We are one of the very few public high schools in America that maintains the relationship, support, and counsel of the Native American. Our **Warrior** represents the authentic Arapaho Warrior, as painted by tribal artist, **Wilbur Antelope**. Our gymnasium is named in honor of tribal elder, **Anthony Sitting Eagle**. We ask all who attend Arapahoe basketball contests to possess the pride and spirit of a Warrior!

We are proud of our Arapahoe Girls Basketball Team, and wish them the best of luck and much success in the 2016-2017 season! GO WARRIORS!!!!



#### **COACHING STAFF**



Coach Knafelc is entering his sixth year as Head Basketball Coach for the AHS Girls' Basketball team. Over the past 6 seasons, Coach Knafelc's Lady Warriors teams have a combined 107-43 record.

Coach Knafelc has a long history of success as an assistant coach on various levels and in numerous sports here at Arapahoe. Among his accomplishments and experiences are: 32 years of coaching football, with 21 of those as a Varsity assistant, 6 seasons as the Head Freshmen Football coach with an 80% "win" ratio. Coach Knafelc also coached wrestling for 20 years, 4 as the Head Wrestling coach at Powell Junior High and has also been a Track and Field coach.

Jerry brings much basketball experience to the table as well with 6 years of youth coaching in Gold Crown/Jam/CSA, 3 years as the AHS Boys' Basketball

Varsity/JV Strength and Movement coach, 1 year as the JV assistant, 2 years as a Varsity and JV practice assistant and bench coach, and 1 year as the Head Freshmen Boys' Basketball coach that finished as league champions.


The funniest thing I remember about basketball is watching the video of myself falling on a hula-hoop my sophomore year and also Coach K's confusing texts.

My words of wisdom for the underclassmen are , "My favorite memories are from basketball season so enjoy it while it lasts."


The basketball program has meant so much to me. "It has given me an outlet from school and life. It has also taught me many life lessons."

By working together within the boundaries of respect to our cultures, we have set precedence in our communities providing a positive solution for our future in the midst of mascot controversy.

The "Arapahoe Warrior" and the history of the Arapaho Tribal Nation are deeply embedded in Colorado. The Arapaho Nation's survival and plight is recognized through the endorsement of the "Arapahoe Warrior". The original version of the "Arapahoe Warrior" logo is the design of Wilbur Antelope, a Northern Arapaho Artist.

For the relationship to continue it must be nurtured by everyone involved, especially the adults. The future facing our young people is determined by today's behaviors, actions, and attitudes displayed by adults. Cooperative efforts are not always easy, but as adults we know "nothing of value is ever earned easily."
